#### **NEWS FROM KINGTON ST MICHAEL COMMUNITY SHOP**

We are very happy to have welcomed two new volunteers to our team. We often get asked what's it like being a volunteer in our shop, so here is a peek into 'A volunteer's life'.

A VOLUNTEER'S LIFE: "My regular 2-hour shift is usually first in the day, so at 8.45am, after unlocking and switching things on, I unpack any early morning deliveries – it could be milk and yoghurt, sandwiches or breads and cakes. Interspersed with that will probably be early morning customers – some looking for caffeine from energy drinks in cans from the soft drinks' fridge, or a takeaway coffee! That prompts me to give the coffee machine its daily clean – remembering to switch it off. I have cleaned the front of the machine in the past, without switching it off, and set it off delivering six consecutive macchiatos!! Bean to cup took on a new meaning for me at that point. Retrospectively it was quite funny, but feverishly stuffing cups underneath the spout was stressful ...until I engaged my brain and switched it off!

We have a diary in which everybody notes any incoming deliveries, or just general things we need to know, so I check that as soon as I can. We also write any nice comments that we get about the shop – there's one most days and they do give you a lift; it's heartwarming to know the shop is enjoyed and valued. I'm sure most volunteers feel a bit relieved that there's no big delivery planned for their shift, but if one comes in, we can put a call out in the WhatsApp group, and someone will usually come down and give a hand, if it's needed.

Next, it's watering the plants we sell and putting them outside - it's such a nice time of year now and the shop looks lovely with flowers outside. Checking over the fresh fruit and veg is next – squishy tomatoes are definitely not nice and if we are short of anything, our 'veg volunteer' tries to make sure we fill the gap that day, if we can. It's amazing how many bananas we sell in a week.

Then it's refilling the shelves. I'm always surprised at how quickly gaps appear – we have so many sorts of biscuits and chocolate, but everyone has their favourite and they like it to be on the shelves. Looking at our new product lines is always interesting; we have gifts on sale now - nice mugs, coasters, dried flowers and a new range of jewellery.

Occasionally, I'll do a shift that's not my regular one – then I am always grateful for the list of things to do on each shift that's helpfully stuck up for us. If you forget to order from Walter Rose, the next lunchtime there will be unhappy customers missing their sausage roll or pasty.

Chatting with customers is always a pleasant part of the shift. Of course, some people just want to come in, get their groceries and leave. But some of our customers enjoy the chance to exchange a few words and like to tell you who will receive the card or gift they are choosing. There are always new faces coming in and it's surprising how many visitors to the village pop in as they pass, looking for local honey or something else from the area to take home.

I enjoy my two hours in the shop – sometimes it's busy, sometimes it's quiet, but there's always something that needs doing. I've met a lot of new people and the team is very supportive - if I ever get stuck, I can just put a message out and someone will message with the answer."
