KINGTON ST MICHAEL COMMUNITY SHOP

Incredibly, it's 18 years since Kington St Michael's village shop first opened. The existing Post Office and shop in the village closed, so a group of villagers got together and formed the team that led to the opening of the shop in May 2007. There was a huge commitment from the volunteer team, supported by the Plunkett Foundation, a charity that supports community businesses that continues to be a useful resource to us today. The shop was also fortunate to have a supportive Parish Council, together with the Village Hall committee.

Villagers were invited to buy shares at £5 each, helping everyone to feel part of the shop's future, even if they only bought one. There was the added perk of a free drink at the AGM, a tradition which continues! Shares are still available to buy and we welcome younger shareholders (16 & over) to help with the future of this vital village resource. If you don't have time to volunteer in the shop, as a shareholder you can still contribute to its development.

At the beginning, it was a balancing act. Unlike now, at that time the shop closed for lunch, shut at 5pm and closed on Saturday afternoons; it was a steep learning curve. Restocking shelves depended on having funds from the previous week's takings! Now the turnover is higher, but the high minimum order value demanded by wholesalers still can't be met and the storage space is limited, so someone still has to drive to Swindon two or three times a month.

As it does now, the shop contributed to the community by using local suppliers whenever possible. The milk, butter, yoghurt, and cheddar are supplied by the same local dairy and eggs from the local business the shop used at the beginning. Other suppliers have come and gone, but the volunteer buyers are always looking out for new local places that can supply products, like the beautiful, locally grown, flower bouquets and Tracklements preserves from Easton Grey. Recently, as well as selling everyday essentials, the shop has re-introduced some interesting small gifts, so that customers can buy cards and presents in one place.

The shop was selling free range turkeys at Christmas long before Morrisons came up with the idea, and Ivan Balmforth and Roger Sealy would drive out to a farm near Swindon to collect the order. One Christmas, the farmer's dog had died and she'd forgotten to put aside the turkey order. Panic ensued, but the turkeys arrived in time for Christmas. In winter, when the village was completely snowed in, a tractor was despatched to fetch the milk from the top of Tor Hill.

The shop remained open during the Covid restrictions and home deliveries came into their own, with volunteers delivering around the village to those who didn't want to come out. Sometimes, people stood in the shop doorway, calling to the volunteer what they wanted, so that they could shop with less risk.

For several years, Avril Balmforth gave her time to voluntarily manage the shop along with Pat Squires as assistant manager, with support from other volunteers. The WI was a good recruiting ground at the beginning and one volunteer, Kay Sambell, has been volunteering since the shop opened. Some people volunteer for a while, life changes for them, they take a break and then return some years later. Others have retired or moved away. There have been paid part time and full-time managers, but now the shop works as a team again, led by Claire Pugh, a paid lead co-ordinator. Many volunteers have their own area of responsibility; others are purely there to serve behind the till. Making sure the shop has enough people to keep open for the hours the village wants can be challenging, so if you would like to contribute, do get in touch. The people who serve in the shop are crucial to its future and success, so even if you can only spare two hours a fortnight, you will be very welcome.

The village shop has experienced some difficult times, but Polling Day this May was the best day ever when 43 ice creams were sold! If you were able to drop in that day, the volunteers would have been very happy to see you and it is hoped that you will be able to continue visit the shop.

Kington St Michael Shop is open 8.45am-5pm Monday-Saturday, and until 6pm on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. The shop is opposite the village church, and you can park right outside. CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUND -

BONFIRES AND SMOKE POLLUTION

During the recent lovely sunny weather there have been bonfires at the north end of the village on weekend mornings, when those who are at work all week have their only opportunity to hang out their washing.

Please be considerate when lighting bonfires and follow this advice from Wiltshire Council:

Lighting a bonfire without consideration for those around you can cause distress, when for example:

- weather conditions are inappropriate (such as winds blowing toward neighbours' property) or
- burning inappropriate materials (such as wet or green plant material, plastic or other materials that will generate smoke)
- on a fine summer's evening when others are enjoying their gardens.

In addition, it may exacerbate ill health in those who suffer from Asthma, COPD and COVID.
